EDITO / EDITORIAL

« Since the spring of 2020, French and American hospitals have contributed to the relentless fight against Covid-19 to protect the lives of their patients. This unprecedented battle has been intense in terms of its magnitude, the level of engagement it sparked among doctors and all care teams, and the cohesion that was built not only inside hospitals but with the full spectrum of regional stakeholders.

Patient care protocols were quickly defined and the measures designed to protect our caregiving staff continually evolved as we gained knowledge about the new virus.

After multiple waves and surges of the pandemic on both sides of the Atlantic, where do things stand today? How have care protocols changed with our expanding scientific knowledge and the viral mutations? What are the long-term consequences for patients with regard to their heart, ENT and even mental health?

The pandemic triggered a major health crisis. It forced more than one half of the global population into lockdown while requiring maximum adaptability from health care workers and organizations as they faced greater workloads and the need to reorganize facilities and make complex decisions. How did they adapt in this climate of extreme uncertainty? Would we know how to manage a future pandemic by applying the lessons learned from the one we're still coping with today?

As everyone anxiously awaits better days, if not the end of this exceptional situation, how can we work to reopen the world when population flow has been blamed for spreading the virus across the planet? What does the future hold for tourism, when approaches to vaccination differ worldwide? »

« Dès le printemps 2020, les hôpitaux français et américains ont contribué à la lutte acharnée contre le Covid-19, pour la vie de leurs patients. Cette lutte inédite a été intense par son ampleur, par l'engagement des médecins et de tous les soignants, mais aussi par la cohésion dont tous ont fait preuve à la fois au sein des hôpitaux, mais également avec l'ensemble des acteurs des territoires.

La prise en charge des patients s'est très rapidement organisée et la protection des soignants a été adaptée en permanence aux connaissances sur ce nouveau virus.

Après plusieurs vagues et ressauts épidémiques de part et d'autre de l'Atlantique, qu'en est-il maintenant ? Comment la prise en charge thérapeutique a-t-elle évolué avec nos connaissances scientifiques et l'évolution du virus ? Quelles conséquences à long-terme pour les patients sur le plan cardiaque, ORL, ... mais aussi psychologiques ?

Cette pandémie a provoqué une crise sanitaire majeure et confiné plus de la moitié de la population mondiale, tout en requérant une adaptabilité maximale des soignants et des organisations sanitaires : charge de travail décuplée, nécessaire réorganisation, décisions complexes... Comment se sont-ils adaptés dans un climat d'incertitude élevé ? Saurait-on affronter une prochaine pandémie en tirant les leçons de celle que nous traversons encore ?

Et comme chacun d'entre nous attend impatiemment l'accalmie, voire la fin de cette situation hors norme, comment organiser la réouverture de notre monde alors que les flux de populations ont été montrés du doigt dans la propagation du virus à travers la planète ? Quel avenir pour le tourisme alors que les approches sur la vaccination divergent à travers le monde ? »



A volunteer doctor at the American Hospital in Paris during the First World War, Harvey Cushing (1869 - 1939) is an American neurosurgeon who pioneered brain surgery.

He is widely regarded as the greatest neurosurgeon of the twentieth century and often referred to as the «father of modern neurosurgery». The name Cushing is commonly associated with its most famous discovery - Cushing's disease.

Médecin volontaire à l'Hôpital Américain de Paris pendant la première guerre mondiale, Harvey Cushing (1869 - 1939) est un neurochirurgien américain, pionnier de la chirurgie du cerveau.

Il est unanimement considéré comme le plus grand neurochirurgien du XXe siècle et souvent désigné comme le « père de la neurochirurgie moderne ». Le nom Cushing est communément associé à sa plus célèbre découverte – la maladie de Cushing.
